CYANOBACTERIA: A BLOOM TO WATCH FOR

What is it?

- Cyanobacteria is a Harmful Algal Bloom (HAB) that can appear in freshwater lakes and ponds or in the sea
- Although given the nickname
 "blue-green algae," it is not actually an algae
- Cyanobacteria is one of the oldest single-celled bacteria species on the planet

Why is it harmful?

- Cyanobacteria is toxic to both humans and animals when ingested or come into contact with via swimming, recreation, and even breathing it in
- Recent studies have found connections between prolonged exposure to cyanobacteria and chronic illnesses, like ALS
